



Features of the Shenandoah House

- 4 PRIVATE BEDROOMS...each with its own bathroom and patio area. Resident bedrooms open onto a patio with access to the gardens. Beds can be pushed to the out of doors by way of the bedroom double doors. Comfortable furnishings will also accommodate overnight stays by family members; personal items may be added to the rooms. Pets are permitted to visit with verification of current vaccinations and flea control.
- THE KITCHEN, SUN ROOM, DINING AND LIVING ROOMS contribute to the overall home-like environment providing cozy areas for residents, families and friends to socialize as desired.
- Specialized bathing facilities will discreetly enable even bed bound residents to enjoy safe and comforting baths.
- The meditation room is available for private reflection and spiritual support. It can be used by residents, families, clergy, and grief specialists.
- The year round sunroom opens out to a covered patio and beautiful gardens with meandering pathways.

Who is Eligible for the Shenandoah House?

- Any Augusta Health Hospice of the Shenandoah patient or individual living with a shortened life expectancy.
- Individuals needing short-term care while family members are on vacation. (1-2 weeks).

How Do I Know If I Am Eligible to Be Admitted to the Shenandoah House?

- If you live alone and there is no one able to care for you
- If you have a caregiver that is physically or emotionally unable to provide your care at home.

The Shenandoah House is on a beautiful and tranquil wooded site on the Augusta Health campus. This loving home is an alternative to institutional care for people who are unable to remain in their own homes during their final days and for individuals needing short term care. The focus of care is to maintain dignity, comfort, and provide assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, medication, cooking, laundry and recreation.

How Do I Get Admitted?

A simple application, physical and tuberculin test from your physician, and a screening by a social worker are required for admission. If you are a hospice patient, your nurse or social worker will help you with obtaining the required information.

If you desire short term placement for 1-2 weeks, talk with the administrator at the Shenandoah House for the required documentation.

Does My Insurance Cover Care at the Shenandoah House?

Medicare and Private Health insurance do not cover residential care. If you have a long term insurance policy, it may cover your stay at the Shenandoah House; you would need to review your policy with your insurance company or agent to determine coverage.



What If I Can't Afford the Daily Charge?

Any patient of Augusta Health Hospice of the Shenandoah may apply for the "gifted care" program which is funded by the advisory board of Augusta Health Hospice of the Shenandoah through the generosity and support of our community. The amount available is dependent upon available funds and your ability to pay. Please talk with your Hospice nurse or social worker about this assistance.

What Will the Resident Rooms Include:

- A variable position bed
- Bedside table & over bed table and areas for personal belongings.
- Guest chairs, recliner
- Lamps, pictures
- Television and telephone are included as part of your room charge.

Can I Bring Personal Belongings?

It is very important for you to bring all medications which you take. The Shenandoah House does not provide any medications. It is either obtained through your own pharmacy or from hospice. You should bring personal items such as those required for shaving, hair care, sleepwear, robe, nonskid slippers.

The rooms are furnished; however, residents are able to bring family pictures and other items that will provide them the comforts of home.
