What should I expect?

After you have been registered, you will be greeted by a Nuclear Medicine Specialist who will take you back to the injection room. The Specialist will explain the exam, the estimated time frame for your test, and begin to administer the medicine for the scan.


The medicine consists of very small amounts of Radioactive drugs that are injected by IV or given orally. Once the medicine is in your system, special types of cameras and computers take the images requested by your physician.

Depending on the type of exam, the Nuclear Scan can take 30 minutes and up to 4 hours to complete.

At any point during your exam you have questions, please let the Nuclear Medicine Specialist conducting your exam know. They will be glad to assist you.

What is Nuclear Medicine?

Nuclear Medicine specialists use safe, painless, and cost effective methods to image the body and treat disease. Nuclear medicine provides doctors with information about both structure and function.





DID YOU KNOW?

The amount of Radiation in typical nuclear imaging is comparable with that received during an x-ray, which is within safe limits.
